This term, teachers will be busy writing school reports. These will be sent out to parents by mid July. An opportunity to discuss further with class teacher will follow, (for those who would like to ask more questions about their child's reports). As always though, we would urge any parent to ask for a meeting at anytime, if you have any concerns about your child's progress.

As we enter the Summer term , we will begin to start talking to the children about next year. Already teachers will be making sure that they are visiting each others classes and we will be continuing our ongoing work around building relationships and making friends. As a teaching team, we have been thinking a lot about transition. For those children moving to Bartley, information will have already been shared with you and for those moving to other settings, you child's new school will be contact, if they have not already done so.

Starting the week beginning 10th June, the children will begin talking about new classes and new groups of friends and also be painting pebbles to present to new children starting school. Changes and transitions will be the focus of our circle time lessons, which will create opportunities for children to talk about how they are feeling.

Teachers have been looking at friendships and groupings for the current Year R children and we will write to both parents and children about their new teachers during this time.

Following this, we will be sending letters and organising opportunities for children to meet their new teachers (where there is a change in teacher) and for children to meet anyone new joining their class.

4th and 5th July will be move up days, where children will be working in their new class groupings.

Art Week

The theme of Art week this year is 'anyone can be an artist' We will be basing activities around the book 'The Dot' By Peter Reynolds. The moral of the story is that anyone can be an artist, just make a mark and see where it takes you. We will start the week inviting parents in to explore their creative skills with the children. We will then be creating our own self-portraits focusing on pointillism and making frames with the idea that they can create work they are proud of and frame them. Throughout the week the children will have the chance to explore and learn new skills as well as learning and singing a school song.
