School Success

We have already had our first Local Authority Improvement Partnership Meeting at Saint Michael's and All Angels, in Lyndhurst. Improvements in academic outcomes in all year groups, at the end of the last year were celebrated. The school's phonics outcomes were a particular success and were the best phonic outcomes the school had ever seen. Last year's Year Two saw more children leaving our school working at age related expectations and above, compared to the previous year, and this positive trend looks set to continue at Saint Michaels in the coming year. Mr Cooper, our Math lead (currently based at Copythorne), was also praised for his ongoing work leading on the further development of Maths across the Federation. Our next Local Authority Improvement Partnership Meeting will be held at Copythorne in November, and we look forward to sharing some of the highlights from that meeting.

Inter-federation Football

Well done to all our Year One pupils who took part in this term's inter-federation sports.

We are thrilled to announce that Copythorne won this terms competition for Year One (closely followed by Netley Marsh).
